#### \*\*NOTE

चार वर्षीय स्नातक (मानद); चार वर्षीय स्नातक (मानद शोध सिहत) और स्नातकोत्तर (पी०जी० अर्हताएं (Eligibility) — प्रथम) पाठ्यक्रम की रूपरेखा चार वर्षीय स्नातक (मानद) एवं स्नातक (मानद शोध सिहत) डिग्री के लिए चतुर्थ वर्ष में विद्यार्थी उपरोक्त दो मेजर विषयों में से किसी एक विषय (जिसका अध्ययन विद्यार्थी ने अनिवार्य रूप से पूर्व के तीन वर्षों / छः सेमेस्टर में किया है) का चयन करेगा तथा सप्तम व अष्टम् सेमेस्टर्स में भी उसी विषय को पढ़ेगा, परन्तु स्नातक (मानद शोध सिहत) डिग्री के लिए विद्यार्थी को पहले से छठें सेमेस्टर तक 75 प्रतिशत अंक अनिवार्यतः प्राप्त होना चाहिए। तीन वर्षीय स्नातक के पश्चात विद्यार्थी किसी नये विषय में परास्नातक में प्रवेश ले सकता है (जिसमें Prerequisite के अनुसार वह अर्ह है), परन्तु एक वर्ष की परास्नातक / चतुर्थ वर्ष की पढ़ाई के बाद उसे कोई डिग्री अथवा डिप्लोमा नहीं मिलेगा। दो वर्ष पूर्ण एवं उत्तीर्ण करने पर ही उसे उस विषय में परास्नातक की डिग्री मिलेगी। त्रिवर्षीय स्नातक के अध्ययन के पश्चात् चार वर्षीय डिग्री के लिए भी विद्यार्थी को उस विषय में परास्नातक में नया प्रवेश लेना होगा जो कि विश्वविद्यालय में प्रचलित प्रवेश प्रक्रिया के अनुरूप परास्नातक की उपलब्ध सीटों पर किया जायेगा।
